- 1) Melissa Massardo moved to approve the minutes from May 4, Rick Parker seconded; passes 3-0-2
- 2) SRTS – Parent survey sent; observations at FH, Memorial and MSMS; Discussion of Walk, Bike & Roll to School day; Parent survey sent out May 16-May 27 – will follow up with Judy, Eileen Sickler and Mildred Nash had questions.
- 3) Follow up Discussion on 128 Business Council Transportation Regionalization Plan – Melisa Tintocalis came before the Select Board to let them know that she is continuing discussion to understand the parameters and commitment level, especially costs. Board provided verbal consent to continue discussions. Question from Rick Parker: Is there an expected financial commitment from the private sector or the public? Nick believes that it is a two-part commitment to request investment from the developers first and then the municipalities. Do not know how those conversations are going. As the project gets shown to the public there may be shifting requirements to ensure success. Revised due date is June 24 for commitments.
- 4) Katherine Bond suggested an agenda item for next meeting – revisit the high school transportation survey.
