Tech startup 128 Technology moves Burlington office

Burlington-based 128 Technology, a technology startup [that's been in stealth mode](#), has plans to move to a 26,706-square-foot office at 200 Wheeler Road in Burlington.

The news comes at a time when Greater Boston technology companies are finding Burlington an increasingly attractive option for office space. Just this week, critical communications technology provider Everbridge [announced plans to move](#) its 100-person team to an office in Burlington Centre that previously served as the headquarters for digital services company Acquia. And web-hosting firm **Endurance International Group** [has plans to double the size of its Burlington headquarters](#).

"Burlington has become a center of gravity in the area for retail, restaurants and services," said [Andy Ory](#), CEO of 128 Technology, in a statement. "Burlington has become, and continues to gain ground, as a place where either established tech companies, or companies that are about to 'break out' choose to locate."

The six-story office building at 200 Wheeler Road, which is known as "The Summit," is located off Route 128 with access to Route 3.

[Michael Dalton](#), [Michael O'Leary](#) and [Blake Baldwin](#) from commercial real estate firm DTZ represented building owner **The Gutierrez Co.** in the lease deal. Brad [Spencer](#) from Jumbo Capital represented 128 Technology.

"Burlington offers the amenities of the city without the cost," Dalton said in a statement. "Here, 128 Technology, Inc. will have the room and the resources to prosper."
