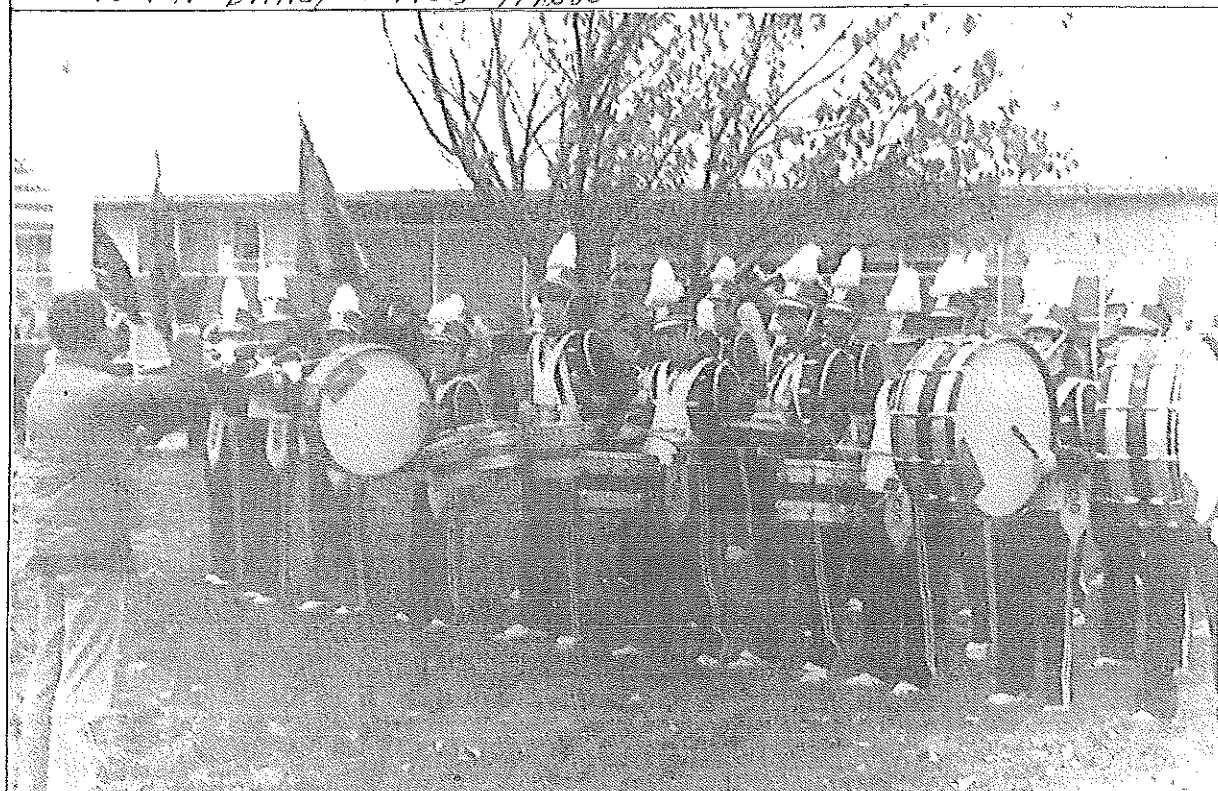
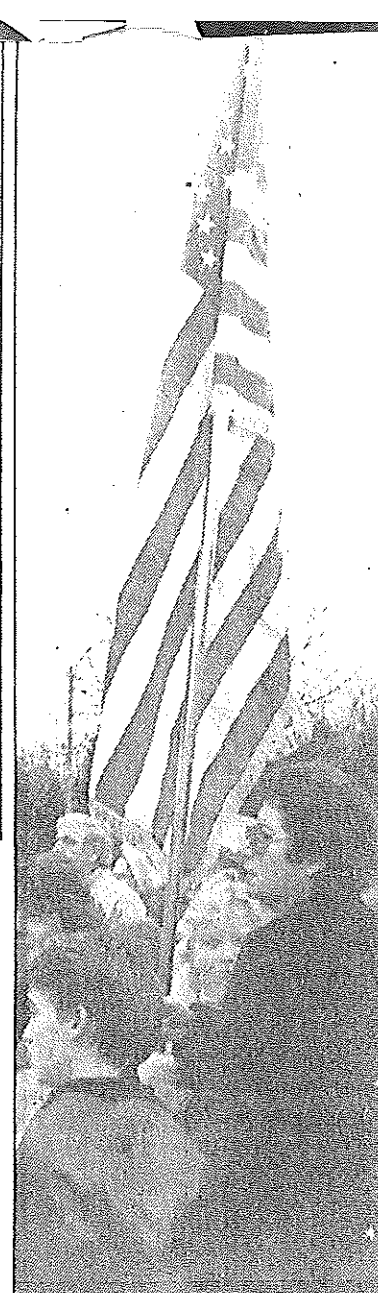

Dashner Memorial during Veterans Day ceremonies yesterday morning at Marshall Simonds Middle School. Gilford F. Dashner was one of seven Burlington young men who fought and died in Vietnam in the 1960s. The memorial was rededicated yesterday after workers elevated it slightly and relandscaped the area. Dozens of veterans and residents participated, including representatives of all local veterans organizations and the Knights of Columbus.
