If at any time an unfavorable condition exists or conduct by a participant or participants is deemed inappropriate, the Director of Parks & Recreation or his/her duly appointed representative reserves the right, in the interest of public safety, to discontinue all activities or dismiss the person or persons detrimental to the activity. As a condition of use, the permit holder agrees to furnish at their own expense, Police or other protection, if deemed necessary by the Director of Parks & Recreation or his/her duly appointed designee, and to reimburse the Town of Burlington for any damages done to the site. I further agree to release and save harmless the Town of Burlington, its officers, employees, agents and attorneys from any and all liability or expenses arising out of any incident occurring at the permitted facility.

Lights:

- Lights are available at Marvin Field, Rotary Field, Varsity Field, Brush (MSMS) Field, and Simonds Park Fields. Lights will be turned off by 11 PM; 10 PM at Simonds Park.
- Light fee is calculated at the current electrical rate

Fees:

- Approved by the Director of Parks & Recreation and are subject to review by the Rec. Commission.

***Non-profit:**

- To qualify as a non-profit the organization must be registered as a non-profit with the State of Massachusetts and provide a 501 (c) certificate. If the non-profit organization is not Burlington based, they must have a Burlington resident as the sponsor. The organization's name must match the name registered with the State of Massachusetts.

****Insurance:**

- Certificate of Liability, naming the "Town of Burlington, including all subsidiaries and affiliates; and all directors, officers, employees and volunteers of such entities" as an additional insured may be required.

Additional fees may be assessed by the Director of Parks & Recreation for staffing, portable toilets and other incurred expenses and are the responsibility of the permittee.

REGULATIONS

SPRING SEASON

1. **Please carry your permit with you to the reserved facility as proof of your reservation.**
2. School teams have priority; you must wait for them to finish, regardless of your permit starting time.
3. Littering is punishable by fines up to \$100.
4. Park in designated areas only. People who park or drive upon fields or courts may be fined and/or suspended.
5. **Alcoholic beverages and smoking are NOT permitted at Parks & Recreation facilities.**
6. If your event is rained out, you must notify the Parks & Recreation Department the next business day so that a make-up date can be discussed.
7. Groups that violate Parks & Recreation Department regulations may have permits revoked and may be subject to legal action.
8. The Recreation Commission reserves the right to revise these regulations at any time and to rule on situations not specifically covered by these regulations.

TURF FIELDS

9. Participants accessing Varsity and Brush fields should cross the track in the designated areas. Protective mats should be placed on the track surface before crossing onto the playing field.
10. When moving goals, nets or other athletic equipment from the playing surface, do not drag across the turf or track surface. Equipment should be placed in designated area that does not interfere with other sporting events.
